## **Group Supervision Opportunity**

I am initiating a supervision group for professional clinicians interested in receiving supervision and consultation from a Jungian analyst. I would expect the group to meet once weekly via telephone conference call and/or webinar (e.g. via Adobe Connect). If the need were present, a group would be formed and meet in Chicago as well. Depending on the size of the group, I would expect that we would meet for 90 minutes per session. The cost for the group would be \$50.00 per session and one would need to commit for a minimum of three months (12 sessions). The size of the group would be kept to a minimum (e.g. four or five per group) to provide ample opportunity for contribution from all members. Group members would rotate the responsibility of sharing case material on a weekly basis. Membership in the supervision group would remain open on a continual basis as long as slots were available.

## **Facilitator - Dr. Warren W. Sibilla**

I earned my Ph.D. in clinical psychology from the California School of Professional Psychology in 1993. Since then, I have completed a post-doctoral certificate in Object Relations Theory and Practice from the International Institute of Object Relations Therapy in Washington, D.C. (1998). In 2007, I was awarded the Diploma in Analytical Psychology at the C. G. Jung Institute in Chicago, IL. I currently facilitate the Process Group in the Analytical Training Program at the Institute as well as serve as the Co-Director for the Clinical Training Program (2010-2012). I hold the rank of Associate Professor of Psychology at The Chicago School of Professional Psychology and currently teach courses in their clinical psychology track. Prior to CSPP, I taught at Indiana University-South Bend for 16 years.

In my private practice, I see children, adolescents, and adults in long-term psychotherapy and analysis. A large share of my practice also involves clinical consultation to Judges, attorneys, probation officers, family case managers, and other professionals associated with various court systems (Federal, Circuit, Superior, Probate) providing psychological assessment, psychotherapy, expert testimony, consultation/teaching, and supervision. I am trained as a Parent Coordinator for court-ordered, high conflict families and serve in this role for many families. I also facilitate retreat experiences for adults utilizing Jung's example of radical introversion as a means of identifying and learning to live in closer relationship to one's inner world. Finally, I am the Director of The Center for Jungian Studies, an arm of my practice providing various outreach services to the local community to include the facilitation of clinical study groups, reading groups, clinical workshops and lectures on topics related to psychoanalysis, analytical psychology, and the integrity of psyche.
