### **A NEW MODEL OF PSYCHOLOGICAL TYPES | JOHN BEEBE | 6 CDS**

Jung's theory of psychological types is an attempt to make comprehensible the regular differences between individuals, and his concepts of introversion and extraversion, thinking, feeling, sensation, and intuition have gained wide currency since their introduction in 1920. However, applying these concepts to practical situations is often confusing. Dr. Beebe's new model of typology shows how the eight types relate to complexes that can be recognized in dreams and styles of behavior. The model, which permits the types to be recognized more easily and with more precision, is illustrated with examples drawn from clinical work and works of creative imagination, such as the plays of William Shakespeare and the films of Alfred Hitchcock.

### **WHOLENESS AND THE LOST AND RECOVERED SOUL | DONALD KALSCHED | DVD**

The concept of wholeness as the ordering and integrating agency of the Self is central to Analytical Psychology and its understanding of individuation. Less recognized is the idea that certain "anti-wholeness defenses" may operate within traumatized individuals, conspiring to keep the personality dis-integrated in the service of survival-in-pieces. In this lecture, we will explore this problem of wholeness vs. dis-integration and look at the "spiritual" implications.

### **THE ARCHETYPE OF SACRIFICE AND THE REGULATION OF ARCHETYPAL ENERGY | ROBERT MOORE | 7 CDS**

This workshop links Jung's alchemical studies and his examination of the archetype of sacrifice to more recent research into the nature and dynamics of grandiose energies in the human psyche. In this program Robert Moore discusses how the decline of ritual containment of these energies in indigenous and traditional cultures has led to an epidemic of increased anxiety, addiction, and violent acting out.

### **PRACTICING THE PRESENCE OF THE OTHER WITHIN | ROBERT MOORE | 4 CDS**

In this program, which contains both lecture and experiential elements, Robert Moore provides background and techniques to help us realize and engage our growth potential. Materials focus on how the Self, Jung's archetypal conceptualization of our true nature, provides signs indicating where growth is seeking to gain our attention in order to be manifested in our personal and spiritual lives.

### **THE JUNGIAN PSYCHE: A DEEPER LOOK AT ANALYTICAL PSYCHOLOGY | MURRAY STEIN | 19 CDS**

This course offers a careful exploration of some of Jung's key theoretical texts. Aimed at giving the advanced student of analytical psychology a greater appreciation of the details of Jung's theoretical model of the psyche, the class proceeds in a systematic fashion through the basic concepts and considers how they interrelate to form a whole.

### **UNDERSTANDING THE MEANING OF ALCHEMY | MURRAY STEIN | 10 CDS**

In alchemy, Jung found images and thoughts that were uniquely fitted to his perceptions of psychological life and that confirmed his views of the spontaneous activity and directedness of the unconscious. Murray Stein presents an overview of Jung's work on alchemy to develop an understanding of the relation of alchemical symbols to the analytical process and individuation.

### **CHRYSLIS: THE PSYCHOLOGY OF TRANSFORMATION | MARION WOODMAN | 1 CD**

Marion Woodman explores the body/spirit relationship, the withdrawing of projections, gender issues, and the surrender of the ego to the Self as these themes relate to personal transformation.

### **SOUL IN EXILE | MARION WOODMAN | 1 CD**

In the keynote address for the *Civilization in Transition* conference, Marion Woodman calls for a greater recognition of "the body's real need to be a home for the soul." Woodman is author of *Addiction to Perfection* and *The Ravaged Bridegroom*.
