We will participate as a group in understanding the dream, first for the sake of the dreamer and then for the possible application of the dream's wisdom to our collective lives.

Introductory readings include Jung's autobiography *Memories, Dreams and Recollections*, Jung's *Man and His Symbols*, especially Jung's article, "Approaches to the Unconscious"

Our first session will be on Tuesday, August 17th or whenever four people have signed up. Our limit will be ten persons. If you wish to begin some introductory reading, here are two good starts:

The instructor will also provide a copy of Jung's article, "The Psychology of the Child Archetype." from the *Collected Works*, Volume 9:1.
