



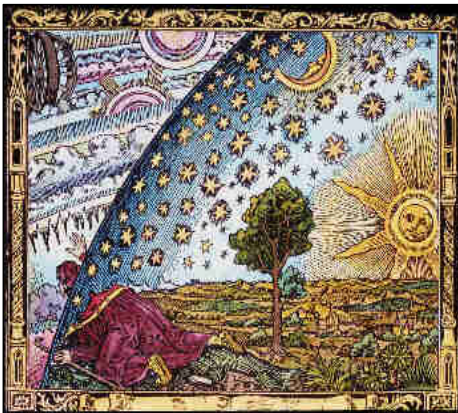

# The Mythological Imagination in Clinical Practice

Mythological themes typically structure human imagination, whether in waking life or in dreams. A distinctive feature of C.G. Jung's Analytical Psychology is the recognition of the mythic patterns – the archetypes of the collective unconscious – as partial determinants of our experience. Using readings from Jung's Collected Works, this course delineates how these patterns emerge in dreams and fantasies to reveal the timeless myths that underscore the reality of the psyche in modern life. This course will explore techniques for incorporating archetypal realities into clinical practice in a meaningful and effective way. The use of the archetypal domain to foster healing and individuation will also be explored.
