- Evaluate Jung's period of "creative illness."
- Identify the psychological tensions or complexes contributing to the rich fantasy material of the Red Book.

**Dr. Moretti** is a clinical psychologist and Jungian analyst in private practice. He holds academic appointment as Associate Professor of Clinical Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Northwestern University's Feinberg School of Medicine, where he has been on the faculty for over 25 years. In addition to standard Jungian analytic approaches, Dr. Moretti's practice utilizes mindfulness meditation techniques, cognitive approaches, and hypnosis.
